Head talk

This week I have attended my first Governing Body meeting as Headteacher of Dedham Church of England Primary School. The governing body of Dedham works incredibly hard behind the scenes to help make the school a robust, publicly accountable and effective place for your children to attend. I thought it would be useful to briefly explain the role of these people, who are they are and some of the things that they get up to.

Governors are unpaid volunteers who have the duty to ensure that the Headteacher and staff are held publicly accountable for the actions and outcomes of the pupils. Each governor has a responsibility to monitor aspects of the school's running. Some of these include:

- Ensuring financial regulations are adhered to, that there is proper budget use and appropriate safety checks on new staff;
- Asking questions about pupil data trends and comparing them to local and national figures to ensure the school is performing well;
- Visiting pupils to ask about the impact and enjoyment of lessons, their safety and happiness in school;
- Regular meetings to explore in depth issues that are hot topics nationally;
- Ensuring the Headteacher is challenged and able to account for all actions.

The governing body meets every half term to discuss teaching and learning and is kept up to date on current initiatives. Governors are also present at events held by the school from sports day to summer and Christmas fayres.

Some governors can be parents, some work for or have roles in the local authority and some are local business people. All governors apply their life skills, experience and business senses to the role and in this way, the school is challenged to be the best it can be from every angle.

Developing Spelling at Dedham



Thanks to money raised by the Parent Group last year, we have now subscribed to Spelling Shed. The Spelling Shed helps children to practise spelling via a simple game which gives four different degrees of support in the form of difficulty modes; Easy, Medium, Hard and Extreme. Higher levels allow a higher score to be achieved but children can practise as much as they like on lower levels before trying to gain high scores. As well as giving children access to lots of spelling lists, Spelling Shed also allows teachers to allocate their own lists (called 'assignments') to individuals, whole classes. These groups and assignments will often be linked to spelling patterns taught during the week and enable children to consolidate their work in school as part of home learning. In EYFS and KS1, assignments will often be linked to the application of phonics into spelling.

Once your child has their login information, they can access the online game via



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https://play.spellingshed.com. There is also a Spelling Shed app for iPads and iPhones (£2.99) but there is NO requirement to purchase the app as our school subscription provides unlimited free access to everything via the website. Adding a website shortcut to the home screen of a device would be my recommendation. The only benefit of purchasing the app as far as I can see is that offline play is possible.

The children in KS2 who have trialled Spelling Shed so far have been extremely enthusiastic about this new resource. As spelling is a key priority on our school development plan, I would appreciate feedback from children and parents about how Spelling Shed is supporting confidence and engagement with spelling at Whilst teachers hope that this home. subscription will provide a valuable tool to parents wishing to encourage more spelling practice, we do understand that more 'screen time' may not suit every family. Suggested spelling rules/lists will continue to be sent home via weekly home learning communications so that spellings can also be practised using other methods.
