#### **Head Talk**

Dear families of Dedham CE Primary School,

I do hope that you and your family are well and dealing with the very challenging circumstances that we are all living through once again. Just as through the school closure to most children last year, I intend to continue with a weekly newsletter to ensure that I have a regular line of communication to you all.

The speed at which things have changed this week has given us all many challenges to overcome. Although heart-breaking that we find our school only partially open, I firmly believe it was necessary. The prevalence of Coronavirus in our community is abundantly clear. Currently, we have three staff, one pupil and a number of families who have returned positive test results during the Christmas break. I am sure you will join with me in sending them our best wishes for a speedy recovery.

Our provision for children of critical workers and vulnerable children has in excess of fifty children attending. This is significantly higher than last time and we are all grateful for the important work that critical workers are doing. I must reiterate that you should only send your children to this group if you are eligible and not able to keep them at home. The key to the success of this lockdown is the reduction in contacts for us all.

Already, 95% of children are accessing their online learning resources shared on Tapestry and Seesaw. Staff will be teaching their year group's curriculum whilst remote learning takes place so thank you for supporting your child's learning at home. We know that many of you are juggling work with childcare and other difficulties at this time. This makes the levels of engagement in remote learning all the

more pleasing. Our offer for remote learning is constantly reviewed and I am grateful for any feedback so that we can continue to improve it further. Some parents have requested that work be posted the evening before. After marking, responding and adapting lessons based on work submitted, teachers have reported that they are often preparing new content into the evenings making this very difficult. However, we have agreed that work will be available from 7:00am each day.

The teaching staff are keen to try to bring some live face-to-face interaction to the school week, for example scheduling a story time with classes. Today, Miss Valentine successfully trialled this with Class 5 using Microsoft Teams and 22 children joined in a class quiz which I'm sure you can imagine caused lots of excitement! She has received lots of positive feedback from children and families about the experience and so we hope to be able to roll this out across the school in the next week once we've ironed out a few technical issues.

I know that a number of families are finding it challenging sharing devices amongst all family members and so please be assured that we will always try to ensure that any live sessions are timetabled to avoid clashes between classes.
